

Interdisciplinary Opportunities

These interdisciplinary opportunities combine courses from the College of Social & Behavioral Sciences with courses from other disciplines to create a well-rounded educational experience and provide students the opportunity to expand their education across several subject areas.




Asian Studies Minor

Students who speak an Asian language, attended a dual-language-immersion program or are currently learning an Asian language can learn more about the Asian culture, history and more.




International Studies Minor

This minor provides students with a well-rounded understanding of global affairs coupled with experiential learning and high-impact activities.




Legal Studies Minor

Learn how the legal system operates and how it influences everyday life. Legal studies helps prepare students for law school or careers in legal practice, politics, government, policing and education.



Military Science Minor

Army ROTC cadets learn leadership skills and receive hands-on experience in managing physical, financial and human resources. They develop self-confidence and superior decision-making skills, making them valued employees in a wide range of fields.



Neuroscience Minor

This program fosters a deep understanding of nervous system function at all levels, from molecules to behavior. It prepares WSU undergraduates for post-graduate programs and careers in research, medicine and clinical work related to nervous system function and dysfunction.




Public Administration Minor

Queer Studies Minor
